






Weighting the Measures

In Other Federal News...

- Carl D. Perkins Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act was signed in July, 2018
- The state transition plan and new state plan will be completed with stakeholder input coordinated by the Workforce Board
- School district applications, compliance, and reporting will continue to be under current state plan guidelines, in alignment with Perkins V
- •The federal act provides guidelines that determine what is permissible with the federal funds, and does not dictate programmatic changes in state law or statute
- The state plan may include amendments (for example, Washington's definition of concentrator differed from suggested federal language under current Act)


Respondents: 30,626

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Multiple Pathways for All

Today, roughly twothirds of all jobs require more than a high school diploma but less than a baccalaureate degree. Increasingly, however, we assume all students will go on to a four-year university, leading to fewer pathways for students to graduate career ready. Washington students deserve an education system that maintains high standards for all students while providing the staff and support to ensure the availability of multiple valued pathways to graduation and post-secondary success. In order to close opportunity gaps, OSPI aims to cultivate an education system that supports students in successfully making an informed decision about their personalized pathway.

GOAL:

Every student has access to a pathway to graduation that prepares them for college, industry credentials, or post-secondary training.


